



FURNITURE ACCESS GUIDE

Each Maker&Son sofa is designed and made to last a lifetime, so we take great care with our deliveries. The team will bring your order directly from our Derbyshire workshop into your home, where it will be carefully unwrapped and positioned in the room of your choice. To ensure everything goes smoothly, we have created this guide to help you double-check the access route before delivery day.

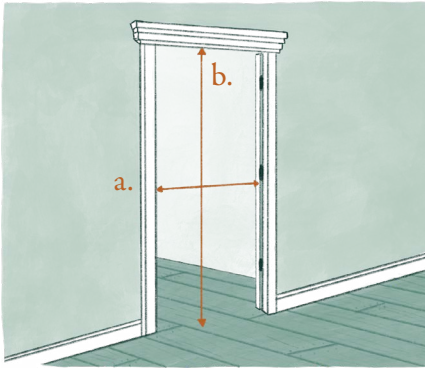
1. MAKE SURE YOUR SOFA WILL FIT IN ITS INTENDED SPACE



We offer a complimentary floor planning service, which allows you to tailor the size and layout of your new sofa to fit your home. Our team can take the measurements of your room, as well as any existing furniture, to provide you with an accurate visual layout.

Bear in mind, if space is tight, that all of our sofas are made by hand, so there may be a size variance of up to +/- 3cm.

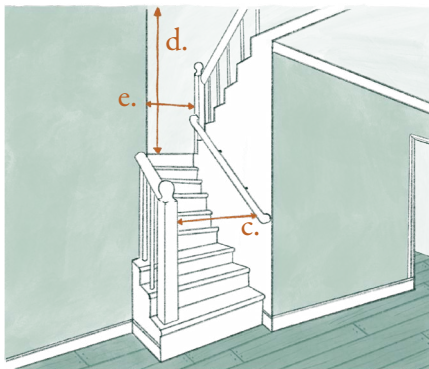
2. MEASURE THE ACCESS ROUTE INTO THE ROOM



Decide on the best route from outside your home to the sofa's intended space. Take note of the smallest measurement of your sofa (usually its height) and measure all doorways, staircases and hallways to ensure they are wider than this.

DOORWAYS

Open each access door as wide as it will go, then measure its width (a). Check for details like door handles that may get in the way.

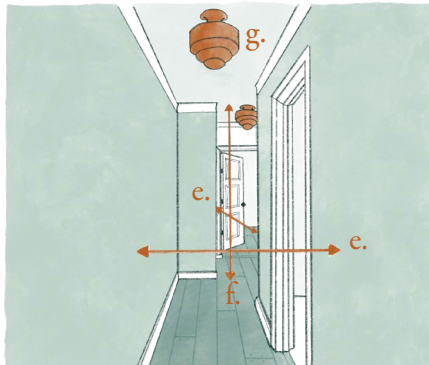


If the space is narrower than the smallest measurement of your sofa, our delivery team may be able to turn the sofa on its end to fit through. In this case, measure the height of the doorway (b) to see if it is wider than the length of the sofa.

A note on lifts: If lift access is required, measure the height and width of the lift doorway as well as the space inside. Check the lift's weight limit is suitable for the sofa and two delivery people.

STAIRCASES

Measure the width of the staircase (c) and account for any handrails. Next, measure the height between the steps and the ceiling (d). If the sofa needs to be lifted over a banister, make sure there is enough room between the rail and the ceiling.



HALLWAYS

Measure the width (e) of any hallways or corridors leading to the room. If there are any tight turns that may necessitate the sofa being turned on its end, measure the hallway height (f) too. If there are any low-hanging light fixtures (g) in the way, confirm that they can be removed or secured out of the way for delivery.

3. FLAG ANY POTENTIAL ISSUES TO OUR TEAM BEFORE DELIVERY



If access to your home can be tricky, let us know so that we can plan accordingly. Consider narrow roads or driveways, gated entries and red routes, for example.

Inside your home, check that any moveable items along the access route have been secured or taken down, such as light fixtures, wall art and mirrors.
